Sermon Title: Standing for Christ in the Public Square

Scripture: Matthew 5:13-16; Matthew 28:18-20

MAIN IDEA: As wholehearted followers of Christ, we are duty-bound to live, speak, and stand for Christ in the public square.

OUTLINE:

- 1. Speak, live, and stand for Christ to rein in the evils of society. (Matthew 5:13-14).
- 2. Speak, live, and stand for Christ to let your light shine before others (Matthew 5:15-16).
- 3. Jesus *has* all authority; people are *in* authority only to the degree that it has been delegated to them by God and his representatives (Matthew 28:18-20).

- 1. Re-read the main passages for this sermon. In what ways does your living as salt and light flow directly from your personal, daily interaction with the Lord?
- 2. What is the relationship between your Christian faith and engagement in the public square?
- 3. In what ways are you active in the public square? What are some ways you could become active?
- 4. Are you typically active or inactive in general elections?
- 5. How could you use your gifts, skills, and talents to make life easier for others from a political perspective? Consider infants in the womb, the elderly, or the freedom to exercise our religion.

- 6. Is it right for you to keep silent if the government tells you that you cannot teach your children about Jesus?
- 7. Describe how consistent Christian living reins in the evils of society?
- 8. Discuss how speaking, living, and standing for Christ gives you a unique opportunity to let your light shine before all men.
- 9. What is the ultimate goal of "letting your light shine?" (See Matthew 5:16b.)
- 10. In what ways can you practice the Great Commission in your community?
