Sermon Title: Walking the "Desire Paths" of Biblical Prayer

Scripture: Colossians 1:9-14; 1 John 5:13-15 (Other Various Passages)

Main Idea: Biblical prayers are like "desire paths" that take you right to the heart of God.

OUTLINE

- 1. Biblical prayers will keep you grounded by looking to the hope laid up for you in heaven (Colossians 1:3-6; 1 John 5:13).
- 2. Biblical prayers will teach you to seek God's glory and will above all else (1 John 5:13-15).
- 3. Biblical prayers will usher you to the beauty of confession of sin and repentance (Psalm 38; James 5:13-16).
- 4. Biblical prayers will help you learn how to grow in sanctification by God's grace (Colossians 1:9-14).
- 5. Biblical prayers will teach you to look for and be thankful for signs of God's grace (2 Thessalonians 1: 3-4; Colossians 1:3-4).
- 6. Biblical prayers will guide you in paths of wisdom (Colossians 1:9-10; Philippians 1:9-11).
- 7. Biblical prayers will coach you in how to cry out to God (Psalm 77; Romans 8:26-30).

DISCUSSION GUIDE

- 1. What are some ways you see signs of God's grace at work?
- 2. What can you identify as the main purpose of prayer based on Pastor Matt's sermon?
- 3. What examples are given for types of prayers we should engage in? This is only a sampling. What are other types of prayer you can identify in the Bible?
- 4. Which of the types of prayer are you most familiar with? Least familiar with?

- 5. What practical steps can you take to start incorporating the idea of 'desire paths' into your prayer life?
- 6. What is the significance of looking to the hope laid up for us in heaven?
- 7. Discuss what it means to seek God's glory and will above all else? How does this relate to asking whatever we wish and seeing prayer answered?
- 8. What role does confession of sin and repentance play in biblical prayer?
- 9. End with time in prayer, practicing praying any one of these (or another) passage of Scripture.
