OUTLINE

- 1. The tongue reveals the heart's contradiction (9-10).
- 2. A split tongue reveals a split heart (11-12).
- 3. Jesus spoke only truth and bore our curses.
- 4. Respond with a surrendered heart and allow Jesus to transform your words from the inside out.

- 1. Read James 3:9–12. What contradictions does James expose about the way we use our tongues? Why does he say "these things ought not to be so"?
- 2. Look at Genesis 1:26–27. How does knowing people are made in God's image change how we speak to (and about) them?
- 3. Think about the Camp Fire illustration. What's a "spark" of careless words you've seen grow into a wildfire in real life?
- 4. Heart check: Where do you notice the biggest gap between your "Sunday words" and your "Monday words"?
- 5. Read Isaiah 53:7 and 1 Peter 2:22–23. What do these verses teach about how Jesus used His words (and when He chose not to)?

- 6. What would it look like for you to surrender your heart first—not just your speech—to Jesus? What might change about your tone, your reactions, or your conversations?
- 7. Who have you hurt with your words recently? What would it take to confess without excuses and seek their forgiveness?
- 8. James 3:11–12 compares the tongue to a spring and a tree. How do these images challenge us to bring consistency to our words?
- 9. Imagine your words tomorrow all coming from a "fresh spring." What would that sound like at work, at home, online?
- 10. What's one specific way your group can hold you accountable this week—not just for what you say, but for what's stirring in your heart?
