OUTLINE

1. Principle: Biblical patience is both active and steadfast.

2. Problem: Lack of trust leads to a lack of surrender.

3. Gospel: Jesus suffered immeasurably while being perfectly patient in the Garden.

4. Response: Trust like Jesus: Communally, Vocally, and Wholly.

Pray, asking the Lord to give understanding as you read His Word.

Read and review James 5:7–12 aloud together. Also, have one person read in another translation for comparison.

Principle:

- 1. In what ways are our hearts like a crop, and what does it look like to prep a spiritual crop?
- 2. How do our tongues "tattle on our hearts" when we are trying to be steadfast in waiting?
- 3. Have you ever tried to control a situation that was in God's control?

Problem:

- 1. Read Romans 5:1-5. What does the Lord say about suffering and surrender and what they produce?
- 2. What other promises besides Jeremiah 29:11 could we count on when we are wrestling with Trust?
- 3. What is an example in your life of when God kept his promise?

Gospel:

- 1. What is an example of suffering in your life?
- 2. Does knowing that Jesus is our mediator change or reinforce the way we pray? (Hebrews 5:7-10)
- 3. When was the first time someone showed you how to go to God for help?

Response:

- 1. What does it mean to Lament (or trust vocally)? Have you ever done it?
- 2. Is there an experience from God that you are not grateful for?
- 3. What would be the impact on your family if you were Grateful and Trusting while Surrendering to God's will? (James 1:2-4)
